The custom stone fireplace is the focal point of this inviting outdoor living space, outfitted in saturated colors and comfortable furniture in a mix of textures.

And while a clay chimenea will suffice, there are many more options from custom design to artful towers of flame that put tiki torches to shame.

Greg Darvin Pristine Pools and River Rock in East Hampton created a custom stone fireplace as the focal point for this outdoor living room in Amagansett. The fireplace anchors a sunken conversation area. From the back, the "window" in the stone frames a view of the swimming pool. "The use of stone as a building material locally has changed and given us much more freedom," says Darvin. "Wood has gotten so expensive that, in some cases, masonry is a more costeffective choice."
